Ukraine Outreach



This month, we held our first large-scale outreach in Ukraine, in the city of Uzhhorod. We currently have three saints there, Nikolaj, Galyna and Anastasia, who recently relocated to be closer to the Hungarian Fellowship. Uzhhorod is positioned on the border of Hungary, Slovakia and Ukraine. Around 50 Hungarian and Czech saints attended the outreach, as well as two from Australia and one from England!

We held morning prayer meetings and full afternoons of outreaching, followed by great evening programs of testimonies, short talks and presentations in the town centre. There were several new visitors at every event, including five at the final morning meeting on Saturday. Our newest Ukraine saints, Pavel and Irina, also joined us, after travelling many hours from their hometown of Mariupol (Pavel is Anastasia's brother).

Now we pray for more revival in Ukraine!



Hungary

Greetings from Hungary where we had three people baptized and spirit filled in a busy June for the work of the Lord.

We started off with a dinner night called Faulty Towers where the word of God was preached to some 30 plus guests resulting in one baptism.

This was followed by an outreach Saturday where we took it in turns to preach the Word over an eight hour period. The following Sunday evening we held a presentation where the theme was Jericho.

The following Saturday we had an afternoon programme where we did survival training where we witnessed to people on how to escape from this world and to those that came along to learn how to survive in the wild.

A presentation of the miraculous healings that we have experienced was held, where we listened to a number of brethren say how God had done the impossible in their lives by healing brain tumours, depression and bulimia. A dying sister could recover enough to encourage and pray with others and sing choruses such as Lord I'm Willing before finally falling asleep.

A mother of one sister was rushed to hospital with her body shutting down, but after prayer she woke up to be able to talk to her family. Our prayers are still with her.

One sister was suffering from panic attacks but after prayer was healed the next day.

One brother who has diabetes forgot to take his medicine and ate some food that was not good for him. On realizing what he had done he prayed and had no side effects.

One brother had prayer for a painful heart and was healed.

One family's car broke down and they had no money or time to fix it before camp. They prayed about it and went to a garage where the mechanic said he was a believer and fixed the car immediately for very little money.

Finally, one brother was having financial problems as he had to pay back loans from college and taxes that had built up. He went to see the authorities to try and resolve it after having prayer and they frankly forgave him of his debt in its entirety.

The final event was a fantastic three day outreach in The Ukraine where about thirty saints from Hungary, the Czech Republic, the U.K. and even Australia went to share the gospel and support the saints there. About

5000 leaflets were handed out and dozens of talks followed and in the evening presentations were given telling the visitors about how to get into the kingdom of God. We are looking eagerly forward to the fruits of this work.
