Editorial: Anger

Have you ever noticed that anger is a built-in property of mankind? All it needs is a *focus* to break out into open violence.

In these modern times it's easy to find a focus. There is non-stop 'news' all day and night and not all of it is real news.

Just last week there was another 'project X' threat in Holland.

This term refers to a disaster which happened last year in a village called Haren, in the North of Holland. A girl wanted to make a big celebration of her 16th birthday and she advertised this on Facebook with an invitation for whoever wanted to come.

Thousands turned up, started a riot and half the village was virtually destroyed.

So this time around, the police stopped all traffic and whoever had no business in the village was turned back.

So, all this needs is for someone to provide a focus for this anger. And there are plenty of people, and even some politicians and governments, eager to provide this focus.



And... what are we going to do about this? There is no solution for the world and mankind in general. There is only an individual escape possible from the results of all of this. *Lu 21:35 For as a snare shall it come on all them that dwell on the face of the whole earth.*

Mostly this focus is aimed at unknown threats. Migration seems to be a big one these days. Some of the most 'advanced' countries in the world seem to be divided about 50/50 on this subject. Jesus, spoke about all of this in Matth 25 and Luke 21. He knew about this inbuilt property of mankind which would break forth in the last days. So...

Ghana trip



Brothers Dan and Eric travelled to Ghana.

« We arrived in Accra and organised to meet the contacts there: Norberg, Eric and Desmond. This ended up with the baptism of Eric and Desmond who both received the Holy Spirit.

We spoke mostly about women preachers and order in the churches, dancing etc. Many have their own TV channels and have a large following, so separation from other churches is something that Sylvester is aware of. A lot of the time I opened up the conversation that we aren't a church that wants your money and we aren't one with money to give.

Kodea is a busy town and has great potential. It is around an hour's drive from Kumasi where Sylvester lives. The old meeting place location wasn't ideal as other churches would be in session at the same time as us which meant lots of noise. The new meeting place is near a local

community housing development and is in a good quiet location about a mile from the main road with a good amount of passers-by.

We visited the saints and their families during the week and encouraged them to get to the meetings and to see if they had any questions about the fellowship.

Sylvester has a brother called Solomon who helps with chorus leading and gives talks. At the end of the trip Sylvester and I were able to spend some time talking about leadership and other points. I spoke about the qualifications in Timothy about leaders and the testimony of his family, and him being the example the people will follow.

Overall it was a good visit and Sylvester continues to be in touch and has enthusiasm for doing the work. »

Kodea has around 18 people regularly attending the meetings and looking at this place I think it would have room for around 60 people so there's room for expansion.

Liberia

In November, myself and Pastor Meschack from Kenya arrived in Monrovia, capital of Liberia in West Africa; we were met at the airport by our brother Jude Nwachukwu – Jude looks after the work in Liberia - and spent our first night in Monrovia. The next day we drove North East for 4 hours to Gbarnga where we met our brother Morris. In Gbarnga, Morris has an assembly of around 50, including children, as well as another group of 25-30 in nearby Police Academy.

Many saints came up from Monrovia and our first meeting saw the hall in Gbarnga absolutely packed. The day following, we spent some hours talking to the leaders and other men, encouraging them to remain faithful and stay separate from the world, and particularly from the Pentecostal groups and their teaching and behaviour.

After the Sunday meeting quite a number of us walked to the river to see 6 baptised and spirit filled with the evidence of speaking in tongues.

On the Monday we drove back towards Monrovia, visiting Weala along the way. There are 17 saints here; the fellowship was started by a sister from this area who was converted in Monrovia and took the gospel back home to her family and neighbours.

The next couple of days were spent with our brother Jude in Johnsonville. We had an evening meeting in their hall and about 50 came.

The following week we flew to Lungi in Sierra Leone. We travelled to Freetown with Pastors Paul Patrick and Samtee. We conducted teaching sessions with a view to establishing the leadership there. The Sunday meeting was attended by about 60 people, 6 of which were taken to the river for baptism. All received the Holy Spirit with the evidence of speaking in tongues.

We then drove to Waterloo where our brother Abednego looks after a group of 20 or so. Once again, we spent time teaching the saints, particularly the men. We had a short meeting, after which a lady was baptised and spirit filled.

The next day, we drove to a new area called Taiama, calling in at Mamara where there are 12 saints, plus a number wanting to hear more. 39 went down with us to the river for baptism – 19 received the spirit and spoke in tongues.

We then drove to Lungi and spent the next 3 days talking to the young men, encouraging them and answering questions. There are about 9 in fellowship here.

The saints in both Liberia and Sierra Leone are very happy to have had the gospel faithfully preached to them. Their numbers are steadily increasing, particularly in the more remote rural areas, and as they gain in understanding and confidence, we are going to see a great revival. The people are eager to hear the gospel and be where testimonies of miracles and changed lives abound and things are done “decently and in order”.
